Questions for Contemplation Following The Session

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WHERE'S MY IDENTITY?

Think back to the "things about me" facts you wrote on your index card during the session. Where do you most heavily base your identity? What do you want to change about where you find your identity?

SHOW UP

How many Sundays per month does your family attend church? In addition to worship attendance, what other opportunities does your child have to build relationships and community within the body of Christ? What is one thing you can do now to begin giving your child more opportunities to build significant multigenerational relationships within the church?

Hint: This might not be a greater time commitment. It might be a step of intentionally developing friendships within the body of Christ or to clear something from your schedule to give your family margin to serve together. (Ex. What "good" thing needs to be given up to make time for something better?)

What things take a higher priority for your family than church? (If I were to ask your children which things hold a higher priority for your family than church, what would they say?)

Take time this week to wrestle through the balance between legalizing church attendance and treating it too flippantly. What is a healthy, God-honoring balance? Consider writing a family statement concerning this, so that when opportunities come up that will cause your family to miss church, you can refer back to the statement instead of letting your emotions decide.
